Seventy Elders and Quail

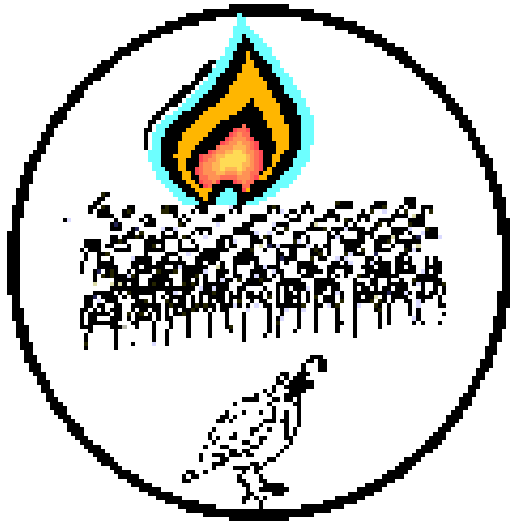

After the tabernacle is built and Aaron and his sons offer sacrifice to dedicate the tabernacle to the Lord, God gives the people to rest of the laws. These laws tell the people how to worship the Lord, how to treat others, and everything else they needed to know to please God. After the people of Israel had been at camp at Mt. Sinai for almost two years the cloud moved from above the tabernacle and the children of Israel set out on their journey toward the promise land again. This time the children went a special order, first, the tribe of Judah, then Issachar, and third came, Zebulun. The tabernacle came next followed by the tribe of Reuben, then Simeon, and then Gad. After Gad the family of Kohath, a Levite, carried all the things for the tabernacle. Then came the tribes of Ephraim, then Manasseh, Benjamin, Dan, Asher, and Naphtali at the end. Any time the Israelites traveled this is the order they were to go in.

Just a few days after traveling the people began to complain. Do you think God was happy when He heard the people complaining? ___ No, God was very angry and sent fire that killed some of the people. The children began to cry to Moses and Moses prayed to God. God stopped the fire. But did the people learn their lesson and quit complaining? NO! Did the people remember how God saved them from the Egyptian army, or how he brought water from a rock when there was no water? NO! Some the people who were from Egypt and were not children of Israel continued to complain. Do you know what they complained about? They were tired of the manna God gave them to eat every morning and wanted meat. They said “We had fish and cucumbers, and melons, and leeks, and garlic, and onions when we were in Egypt. But all we have now is manna.” And they complained and complained and complained. Moses heard them and God heard them. Moses was unhappy with the people and God was angry with the people.

Moses spoke to God and said he did not know what to do about the people and he could not take care of so many people alone! And he asked God to kill him so that he would not have to deal with the people alone. Did Moses have to deal with the people alone??? No, he had forgotten God was with him, he was not alone. But God told Moses to chose 70 men of the elders of Israel. These men would help Moses deal with all the people and Moses would feel like he was alone any more.

After Moses chose the 70 helpers the Lord sent a wind from the sea bringing quail, and quail, and more quail. The people of Israel gathered quail all that day, all night and all the next day, and spread them out all over the camp to dry. Then they began to greedily stuff the quail in their mouth. Before the people could even chew and swallow the quail God became angry with the people for their greed and sent a very great plague among the people that were eating the quail.

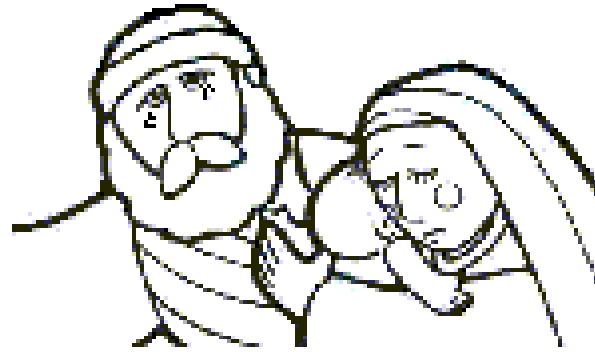
